The third Gala on February 3, 2004, honored Mrs. Barbara Griffin, Mrs. Frankie Newman, and Mr. Herbert Wood (deceased). This year on February 1, 2005, we were proud to induct Mrs. Joyce W. Cribb, Mrs. Elizabeth Bridges Hammond, and Mr. Benjamin Russell Moye. Photographs of all the recipients are hanging in the school's east wing conference room.

BCHSF EDUCATORS HALL OF FAME INDUCTEES—2005



MRS. JOYCE W. CRIBB

Mrs. Joyce Cribb, a native of Florence, graduated from McClenaghan High School. She earned her BS degree at Columbia College. She obtained her Master's degree from the University of South Carolina and had completed all 30 hours of course work on her Doctorate except for the thesis when she became ill.

Mrs. Cribb taught at Brookland-Cayce High School from 1959-61 and from 1967 to 1996 — a total of 32 years. At the same time she taught in the Business Department of Columbia Junior College (now South University) at night for 36 years. For some years she served as Department Head of Office Occupations at B-C. She was the advisor of the Future Business Leaders of America organization, coordinated the student work program, and worked as Business Manager of the *Bearcat*. Mrs. Cribb also served as a State

Department of Education Consultant on book selections for office occupations.

She was B-C's representative on the Lexington District II Superintendent's Council and for SAFE Federal Credit Union. She was a member of the NEA, the South Carolina Education Association, the LCEA and the BCEA. She was also a member of Rho Chapter of Delta Kappa Gamma International, an honorary teacher society.

Mrs. Cribb was active in Virginia Wingard Methodist Church, serving on the Board of Trustees, teaching Sunday School, delivering children's sermons, and advising the MYF. She was Assistant Director of the Children's Choir and directed Christmas pageants.

She was twice named "Teacher of the Year" at B-C. The *Bearcat* was dedicated to her and she received the Faculty/Student Service Award. Mrs. Cribb was always involved in activities at B-C because of her love for the school, its faculty and its students. She headed many of the school's community projects, such as gathering canned goods for the needy, fund drives, etc. She has been an inspiration to both students and staff for many years.

ELIZABETH (BETH) BRIDGES HAMMOND

Mrs. Elizabeth (Beth) Hammond was born in Greer, South Carolina. She graduated from Fairforest High School and received an AB Degree in English and history from Carson-Newman College, furthered her education at North Greenville College, and earned her MAT-English Degree from the University of South Carolina in 1972.

Mrs. Hammond came to Lexington District II to teach at Airport High School in 1963. She also taught at Fulmer Middle School and, after one year at J. L. Mann High School, she returned to Fulmer Middle, where she served as Head of the English Department from 1967-1975. Mrs. Hammond then moved to B-C High School, where she taught until retiring in 1997.

In addition to teaching English, Mrs. Hammond was the *Laureate* Advisor, an SAT Coordinator, and Chairman of the Curriculum Committee (Honors and AP English). She was also involved in the Brookland-Cayce Education Association, serving as a Hall Representative and as Secretary.

Her most rewarding teaching experience was working as advisor of the *Laureate*, the B-C High School award-winning literary magazine. In 1992 Mrs. Hammond received the Reid H. Montgomery Advisor-of-the-Year Award, which was given for outstanding service to scholastic journalism. She also received the National Council of Teachers of English Highest Award for Excellence in Student Literary Magazines in 1996. Mrs. Hammond was given the Student Council Faculty Service Award in 1997.

Among many community activities, Mrs. Hammond served as President of the South Carolina Writers Workshop and was co-editor of *Horizons*, the SC Writers Workshop publication. She was a member of Shandon Baptist Church and taught single adults. She was also active in Rho Chapter of Delta Kappa Gamma International.

Beth Hammond was a teacher of the heart. She gave her students the benefit of her knowledge, experiences, and care. She passed away in 2000. The inscription by Henry Adams engraved on her tombstone — "*A teacher affects eternity*" — describes her accurately and precisely.



BENJAMIN (BEN) RUSSELL MOYE

Mr. Benjamin Russell Moye was born in Augusta, Georgia. He graduated from Richmond Academy. He earned a BS degree in business from Presbyterian College in 1942. He worked summers on his M.Ed. receiving it in 1950. Meanwhile, Mr. Moye coached all sports at Greenwood High School for one year. He then returned to Presbyterian College to coach. He moved to Brookland-Cayce High in 1950 and continued coaching until 1958. He coached for two years at Irmo. He then went into the real estate and insurance business.

Mr. Moye played football one season with the Cleveland Rams. He also served in the U.S. Air Force and played on the Air Force football team.

Mr. Moye has been honored by the West Columbia/Cayce Civitans being named Civitan of the Year three times and by serving as President. He was Head Coach of the NC/SC Shrine Bowl Team in 1955, and he was inducted into the Presbyterian College Hall of Fame. His induction into the Brookland-Cayce Athletic Hall of Fame, the Ben Moye Scholarship in the B-C Foundation, and the Ben Moye Athletic Field in Cayce also reward his influence. An Air Force flag was placed in his honor at the Brookland-Cayce High World War II Veterans Memorial. In 1963 in Cayce-West Columbia, he organized Little League Football, which later spread over Lexington County.

Coach Moye coached young men in different sports and in living. He believed in discipline and fair play. He insisted his students be good scholars and good citizens before they became ball players. It is evident that he is a success by the esteem these former students have for him today. He recalls that a teacher and a coach had a tremendous effect on his life, which challenged him to be the same type of coach and teacher. He is remembered for his loyalty, inspiration an encouragement to his players and to others.

BCHS FOUNDATION MENTORING — “WINGMAN” PROGRAM

The mentoring program at Brookland-Cayce High School was proposed in the fall of 1998 by president, Ed Kirkland. His goal was to develop a program that would provide a “wingman” (an aviation term, the wingman supports the lead aircraft) for B-C students who need extra support in their lives. Thus, the present BCBS Foundation Wingman Program consists of volunteer adult mentors who meet with and serve as positive role models for identified B-C students.

The foundation also sponsors the Junior Wingman program. Selected eleventh grade students are trained and supervised by teachers and counselors to serve as mentors for ninth grade students through an organized program of activities.
